Until their most welcome return next week, we are grateful to our lunch catering partners for their excellent service and willingness to scale up so quickly and so efficiently to help us continue our mission to serve the community in this way. I would like to especially recognize our Food Services Director, Dave Dziki, who has been on site everyday throughout this crisis to ensure that daily lunch is prepared and packaged safely and served attentively to all those who seek it. Dave Dziki is another of the many folks in our school district whose efforts on behalf of our school community help to make it such a place. Thank you Dave.
