



## Visit Campus


- Information session, tours, open houses, virtual tours



# Admission Options

Admission Type	Details	Deadline	Commitment
Early Decision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cannot apply to more than one school ED</li> <li>• If admitted, student agrees to enroll and withdraw all other applications</li> <li>• Student, parent, and school counselor sign contract</li> </ul>	October – November  Some schools will offer EDI and EDII	Binding
Early Action (EA)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applications reviewed and decisions sent early</li> </ul>	November – December  Some schools will offer EAI and EAI	Non-binding
Regular Decision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All applications reviewed after hard deadline</li> </ul>	January – March	Non-binding
Rolling Admission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• First come, first served</li> <li>• Applications reviewed as received</li> <li>• Class may be filled early in cycle, so apply accordingly</li> </ul>	Within a specific time-frame until class is filled	Non-binding
Direct Admission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student offered acceptance before applying based on certain criteria, such as self-reported GPA or demographics</li> <li>• In general, must complete application and meet all eligibility criteria</li> <li>• Common App, Niche, school-specific</li> </ul>	Throughout admission cycle	Non-binding



- Opens August 1st
- Accepted by over 1,000 schools
- Fee waivers available

## College-Specific Application

- Found on college website
- May waive application fee

# Standardized Testing

## Test-Optional Admissions

- You decide whether you want to submit test scores
- Scores may be required for merit scholarship consideration

## Test-Blind Admissions

- Test scores are never considered


- Which majors require these?


