




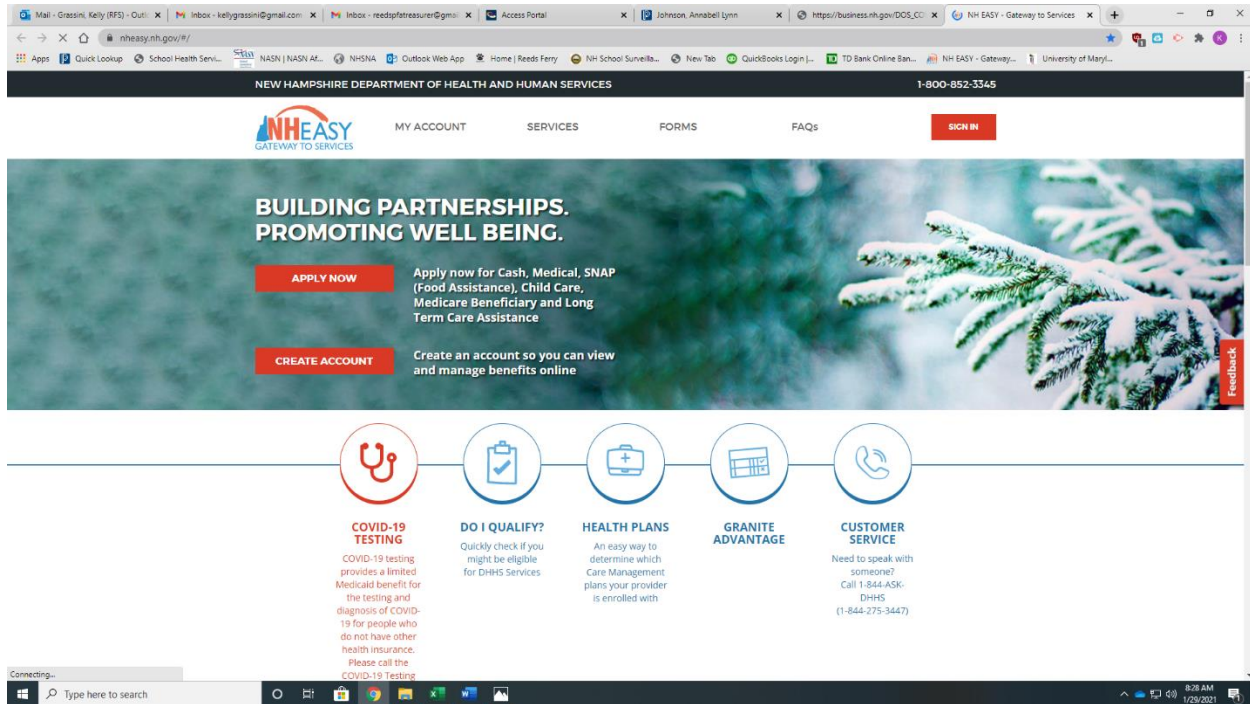

Use of antigen testing should ideally occur within 7 days of when symptoms develop." Another note states: "This form is solely used by NH Homeland Security and Emergency Management to coordinate the scheduling of COVID-19 testing in conjunction with the New Hampshire National Guard. Your information will be kept confidential and only used for diagnostic and tracking purposes. In filing this form you are voluntarily sharing this information for the purpose of your sample collection. Information on this site will be shared with the New Hampshire Division of Public Health Services for public health purposes." A section titled "Under the authority provided by the Families First Coronavirus Relief Act (FFCRA), New Hampshire has opted to implement a new Medicaid eligibility group to cover COVID-19 testing services for individuals who are uninsured or have certain limited health coverage. Individuals must apply and qualify for this testing group and will need to provide a social security number and self-attest to being a resident of New Hampshire and either a US Citizen or having a qualifying immigration status on the application. There is no income or resource test for this group. Covered services include only COVID-19 testing and testing-related services, including anti-body (serological) testing. Please note that this Medicaid group does not cover treatment or medication for COVID-19, and does not cover any other services other than the COVID-19 testing services. If you would like to find out if you are eligible for a different Medicaid group that covers more than COVID-19 testing services, please visit NH EASY by clicking this link <https://nheasy.nh.gov/#/>. You will find information about other DHHS programs you may be eligible for as well." A note states: "Note that you should still request a test and follow the instructions once your test is scheduled while your Medicaid application is being processed." A note states: "NOTE: Go to [COVID-19 PCR Testing Options](#) for additional sites not listed below." A section titled "Testing is available regardless of insurance status *" includes a note: "* If you are interested in coverage for COVID-19 testing, there is a new Medicaid plan that you may be eligible for; select the checkbox below to complete a short application."

Click on the <https://nheasy.nh.gov/#/> link part way down

Click Continue to NH Easy



Click on the stethoscope and fill out the form, this is not signing up for Medicaid, but signing up to get the test paid for

Go directly back to the COVID-19 Testing Request and fill out that form, you do not have to wait for the 7-10 days for the NH Easy paperwork to go through

- Choose Test-PCR is if you are having symptoms and antigen is if you are not having any symptoms
- You must choose something in all 3 of the dropdowns for the testing location-I chose Londonderry in all 3, it is the closest

- You will need to choose the date and 3 preferred time slots
- There is a spot on the bottom that says: Indicate Any That Applies To You-make sure you click on the last option that says Daycare/K-12 School-Aged Child
- Hit submit and you will get an email or a call to let you know your appointment date and time slot
- It is a drive-thru site off Exit 5 in Londonderry
