Please read on for some important information and dates for the rest of September:

This week Mr. Zampieri, Mrs. Hanlon and I met with each class, and we reviewed some important information they needed to know to begin the school year. Part of that discussion was a brief introduction to our updated safety protocols, which the district, in consultation with the Merrimack Police Department have been working on since last year.

Next Tuesday, September 27th during an extended Homeroom, School Resource Officer, Ryan Milligan, and I will be providing our students with a PowerPoint Introduction to our updated Option Based Lockdown Plan, "Avoid, Deny, Defend". Throughout the school year we will conduct practice trainings in all drills related to "Avoid, Deny, Defend". These types of drills had been put on hold for quite some time due to the Covid Pandemic. It is time to resume these important training drills to best prepare our students and staff, should an emergency present itself.

In addition, our District Level Crisis Response Committee has updated our Emergency Management Procedures Flip Chart for classrooms and our Building Level Safety Team will be providing each room in the school with an emergency "Go Kit", which will contain Department of Homeland Security recommended supplies, in case of an emergency.

Lastly, our Back-to-School Night is scheduled for next Wednesday September 28th from 5:30-7:30. I sent an email about this to you earlier this week. I will send out the details of that event on Monday, September 26.
