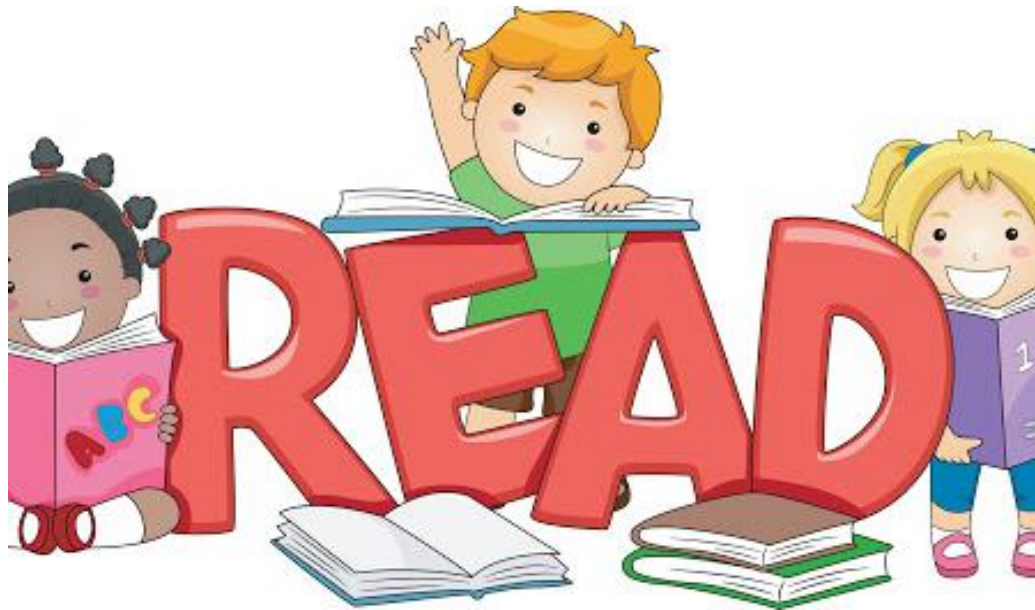

Frequency of Instruction: Tuesday-Thursday 8:30 AM to 11:30 PM

Format of Instruction: In Person at RFS

Focus of Instruction: Reading and/or Math Instruction

# Title I Digital Reading Academy Grades 5-8



- Instructional Model:
  - Customized Reading Skills work using online instructional programs
  - Weekly one-to-one Zoom tutoring sessions for follow-up skill-based work, corrective instruction, and feedback.

## Title I Digital Reading Academy Grades 5-8

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- Program Facilitator: Nicole Diggins and Laura Piccolo
- Location: Remote
- Dates of Program: July 5, 2022 – August 11, 2022
- Frequency of Instruction: Flexible Scheduling  
Monday - Friday
- Targeted Students:
  - Students who are currently enrolled in the 2021-2022 Title I program plus an expanded list of newly selected Title I students based on Spring assessment data.
  - Students must be invited in rank order, neediest first, based on multiple-educational criteria.

  - The 8.5 program helps struggling students who need more support during their transition into the high school.
  - Provides enrichment for incoming ninth graders of all academic abilities.
  - The program's goal is to prepare all students for their time at the high school.
  - Our students go on to classes of all levels, foundations to honors.

## High School 8.5 Program

- Program Facilitator: Ron Delude
- Location: MHS In-Person
- Dates of Program: July 5, 2022 – August 11, 2022
- Frequency of Instruction:
  - Monday–Thursday: 4 days a week
  - Four hours per day
  - Students can earn up to 1.0 credits towards graduation
  - Six-week program – English, Math, Social Studies, SEL Intervention, with special education support
- Targeted Students:
  - Struggling students who need more support during their transition into the high school, and enrichment for incoming ninth graders of all academic abilities.
  - Additional supports through Special Education and SEL supports to students attending this program.



# Credit Recovery Program

## High School Credit Recovery Program

- Instructional Model:
  - Serves the same role as the traditional summer school program
  - Allows students to earn credit in courses they previously failed
  - There are two, 130-minute classes each day.
- Program Facilitator: Ron Delude
- Location: MHS In-Person
- Dates of Program: July 5, 2022 – August 11, 2022
- Frequency of Instruction:
  - Monday –Thursday: 4 days a week
  - Six-week program

# ESY Instructional Model

- As part of their [Individualized Education Program](#) (IEP), for a student to receive ESY services, the student must have experienced:
  - substantial regression and recoupment issues during the previous IEP year
  - evidence of emerging skills which are often referred to as "breakthrough" skills
  - there are learning gaps created as a result of the Pandemic and the disrupted learning that occurred in 2020-2022
  - Determined by IEP team annually
- The focus of the services provided to the student as part of an ESY are to provide practice to maintain previously acquired or learned skills, or address gap skills.
- Specialized instruction and related services are identified in ESY section of the IEP, specialized transportation is provided to all.
- Some students may require additional instruction and/or related services beyond the five- or six-week program. Those services are available in June and August and are determined by the IEP team.



# Special Education ESY Program Grades Pre-K-6



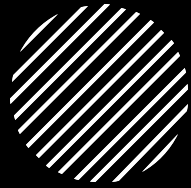
- Program Coordinators: Nancy Romero and Karen Baldasaro
- Location: MES and JMUES
- Dates of Program: Pre-K-6: Main Program
  - July 5, 2022, to August 4, 2022
  - 5 weeks
  - Monday –Thursday for four-day program
  - Tuesday – Thursday for three-day program
  - Two, three, and four- hour blocks daily as prescribed by IEP
  - Additional extended summer instruction and related services determined by special education IEP team available in June and July
- Frequency of Instruction:
  - 4 days a week, or 3 days per week
  - Pre-K-6: One on one and group instruction for specially designed instruction as prescribed in ESY IEP
  - Related services as prescribed, Specialized transportation provided
  - Integrated SEL Supports for students attending this program
- Targeted Students:
  - Students with Disabilities who qualify
  - Services are individualized and driven by ESY specified in IEP

# Special Education ESY Programs Grades 7-12

- Program Coordinator: Scott Riddell
- Location: MHS – In Person
- Dates of Program: July 5, 2022 – August 11, 2022
- Frequency of Instruction:
  - 4 days a week , up to five hours per day as prescribed by IEP
  - One on one and group instruction per ESY IEP
  - Related Services per ESY IEP, Specialized transportation provided
  - Integrated SEL supports for students attending this program
- Targeted Students:
  - Students with Disabilities that qualify.
  - Services are individualized and driven by ESY specified in IEP



# Summer PASS Program for Grades 5-7



- Program Facilitators: Nicole Delani, Erin MacLean, Dan Varela
- Designed for our grades 5-7 students who receive specially designed instruction through their IEP and PASS program placement for school year 2021-2022
- July 5, 2022 – August 4, 2022, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday In Person
- SEL supports offered through the Home School Liaison
- Includes two field trips for real life application and prosocial recreation and leisure activities

# Integration of Summer Supports for SEL

- Integrated into all programming for general education, at-risk, and special education programs
  - Utilizing “fun” low-lift, high impact programs accessible to all teachers
- Continued Pilot of “Mindful Moves” - expanding amount of time and grades 2-6 to address skill building for those with attendance and access issues related to lagging skills in the areas of self-awareness and self-management
- Pilot of a collaboration with the Merrimack YMCA for Grades 7 and 8 targeting students with attendance and academic issues, with a focus on relationship building, self-esteem, and leadership skills
