### The Community

Located in Southern New Hampshire, Merrimack High School serves the town of Merrimack, New Hampshire. The current population estimates are approximately 26,000 (2018). MHS enrolls around 1200 students in grades nine through twelve. MHS is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Students at MHS run on a modified block schedule with two semesters of two quarters.

# **Graduation Requirements**

All students graduating from MHS must earn a minimum of 21 credits. Merrimack High School grants credit at the end of each semester for both year and semester long courses. Yearlong classes are broken up into two individual semesters. Students are expected to pass each semester and meet all course competencies to obtain full credit for the course.

#### **Advanced Placement**

In May 2023, a total of 99 students took 176 AP exams in 17 different subjects. 71% of the AP exams received a score of 3 or higher. 42 students received a 3 in any area. 34 students received a 4 in any area. 24 students received a 5 in any area.
