QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE SCHOOL MEALS UNDER THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (USDA) NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM (NSLP)

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Merrimack School District offers healthy meals every school day under the USDA National School Lunch Program. Breakfast pricing: **Elementary** \$1.75, **Upper and Middle** \$2.00, and **High** \$2.25. Lunch pricing: **Elementary** \$3.50, **Upper and Middle** \$3.75, and **High** \$4.00. Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals under this program. If your household qualifies for reduced-priced meals, Breakfast would be at no cost for all grade levels and lunch would be priced at \$0.40 for all grade levels. Below are some common questions and answers to aid in the process of determining your child's eligibility.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from **NH SNAP** or **NH TANF**, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a <u>foster care agency or court</u> are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your household's income is within the limits set by the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines in the chart below.

2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILD(REN) QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY?

- Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Jocelyne Pinsonneault at (603-365-7111 or jpinsonneault@sau26.org
- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD?

No. Use one Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We
cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the
completed application to: Merrimack School District, Department of Food Services, 36A McElwain St,
Merrimack, NH 03054 or your child's school kitchen.

4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILD(REN) ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS?

 No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact, food services, 603-424-6226 immediately.

5. MY APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE?

 Yes. The application is only good for that school year and for the first 30 days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school has informed you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

6. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS?

• Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced-price meals based on <u>income</u> application.

7. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED?

Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.

8. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER?

Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian
who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income
drops below the income limit.

9. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION?

• You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling (603-424-6200) or writing to: Matthew Shevenell, 36 McElwain St, Merrimack NH 03054.

10. MY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN?

 Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.

11. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME?

• List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.

12. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT?

Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application or may
not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income
fields are left empty or blank, those will <u>also</u> be counted as zero. Please be careful when leaving income
fields blank, as we will assume you <u>meant</u> to do so.

13. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY; DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY?

Your basic pay and cash bonus must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for
off-base housing, food, or clothing, or receive Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance payments, it
must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization
Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from
deployment is also excluded from income.

14. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY?

• List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application.

15. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR?
