

Citing Your Sources



A quick reference guide for bibliography in the MLA format.

A bibliography is a key component of any research project. It is important to remember that any resource you take information from (from facts and quotes to pictures) must be credited. Listed below are examples of citations from a variety of common types of resources you may use for your assignment. For resources not listedhere, please see the librarian for help!



Print Sources



Books with one author:

Author of Book (Last Name, First). *Title of Book*. Place of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication.

Publication Medium.

Ex. Markel, Rita J. *The Fall of the Roman Empire*. Minneapolis: Twenty-First Century Books, 2008.

Print.

Books with more than one author:

First Author of Book (Last Name, First), and Second Author (First Name, First). *Title of Book*. Place of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Publication Medium.

Ex. Norman, A.V.B., and Don Pottinger. *A History of War and Weapons: 449 to 1660.* NY: Thomas Y. Crowell Company, 1966. Print.

- **If there are <u>3 authors</u>, list the first author, last name first followed by the following 2 authors, first name first.
- Ex. Smith, Tony, John Johnston and Carl Krauss.
- **If there are more than 3 authors, list only the first author, followed by the phrase **et al.** instead of the additional authors' names. Or, you may list all of the authors in the order in which their names appear on the title page.

Encyclopedia

Author of Article (if available). "Title of Article." Title of Reference Work. Edition. Date of Publication. Publication Medium.

Ex. Joes, Anthony James. "Rome." World Book Encyclopedia. 2005 ed. 2004. Print.

Works With Editors

Editors of Work, followed by ed(s). *Title of Book*. Place of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication.

Publication Medium.

Ex. Woolf, Alex, Tamara Colloff-Bennett, and Steven Maddocks, eds. *Exploring Ancient Civilizations*.

NY: Marshall Cavendish, 2004. Print.

Periodicals (Magazines)

Author(s) of Article. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine. Date of Issue: Page numbers.

Publication Medium.

Ex. Bennett, Paul. "Rome's Ruins." *National Geographic Magazine. Jul. 2006: 74-82. Print.***For magazines that are published weekly or bi-weekly, list the date in the following format: dd/month/year. i.e. 04 Jul. 2006.
